The rebels at the time were giving us a considerable artillery fire, Soon we reached our old works. We had two lines, one in rear or other and directly behind the first line where our brigade was. There were ten pieces of artillery as soon as we got back. The ten pieces of artillery I have spoken of commenced firing over our heads as you will see by the descriptions I

have given. I was in the breastworks looking at the effect our shell was having on the advancing rebels when one of the shells being poor exploded in our rear and struck the ground about three rods from me. One piece of it struck on man he has since dies of the wound. And one piece struck me almost between the shoulders in the back. It did not srike me square in the back. If it had the surgeon said it would have killed me, “ fortunate to escape, day after being hit regt. had a sharp fight & lost 48 men KIA, WIA (& by) sniping.
